Sri Maan Mahapurakh Sant Baba Tara Singh Ji was the founder of Sampardai Kaar Sewa Sant Baba Tara Singh Ji and of Guru Gobind Singh Khalsa College. He was born to Baba Manna Singh Ji and Mata Mangal Kaur in Sarhali in 1927. He performed all the social responsibilities as a member of a joint family for thirty years with complete dedication and sincerity. He had a religious bent of mind. He had a strong desire to spread the Sikh religion and the message of love and brotherhood in the society. In 1957 he dedicated his life for the upliftment of the society in this area. With this end in view he established Guru Gobind Singh Khalsa College in 1970. He remained the founder patron of this college till he breathed his last. Under his patronage the college began to make rapid strides of progress in different fields. He also performed service of yeoman in other social fields and earned name and fame not only in Punjab but also in other parts of the country. Baba Ji was a votary of brotherhood and worked tirelessly throughout his life for it. Baba Ji respected every religion without prejudice though he was an adherent of Sikhism. During his discourses he used to refer to other religions to make his points clear. Baba Ji established community kitchens, educational institutions and clinics in several parts of the country viz Rajasthan, Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh and Uttar Pradesh. Sampardai Kaar Sewa Sant Baba Tara Singh Ji is now performing the Kaar Sewa of Sikh Gurudwaras in Bangla Desh also. Baba Ji used to spend money from his own pocket on the marriages of the daughters of needy and have-nots. The ceremony of Amrit Sanchar was used to be performed on the day of Sakranti every month. With his initiatives, millions of people were baptised during his life time. He breathed his last on 18 Poh 1987. He had nominated Sri Maan Mahapurakh Sant Baba Charan Singh Ji as his successor. The deeds done by Baba Ji are still engraved on the minds of the people. His contribution in the fields of education and social services is matchless. With his blessings the college transformed into a big institution. It has now become famous not only in the district but also in the entire state. The college is performing a big service to the students of the area.

Sri Maan Mahapurakh Sant Baba Charan Singh Ji was born in 1954. He was a younger brother of Sri Maan Mahapurakh Sant Baba Tara Singh Ji. He used to remain absorbed in Naam Bani right from the beginning. After the passing away of Sri Maan Mahapurakh Sant Baba Tara Singh Ji on Poh 18 1987, he became the head of the Sampardai Kaar Sewa Sant Baba Tara Singh Ji. He was an ascetic and for him kirtan was a food for the soul. He did not use medicines throughout his life. For him Gurbani was the ultimate refuge. Baba Ji always laid stress on the purity of character of those who preached Sikhism. Baba Ji had a special devotion and respect for the Gurudwara Guru Ka Mahal. Digging of wells to fulfill the need of potable water was one of the special activities he was interested in. The Hindus and the Sikhs held him in high esteem. He used to refer to different religions during his discourses to make the points clear. Baba Ji made special contribution to enlarge the sphere of activities of the Sampardai. Besides the construction of schools, colleges, hospitals and other social institutions, he got constructed lanes and drains in villages. The college made a comprehensive progress under his patronage. He had very cordial relations with the college staff. He spent his entire life in the service of the people. He left this world on July 11 2001. Before that he had appointed Sant Baba Sukha Singh as his successor. Every year the death anniversary of Sri Maan Mahapurakh Sant Baba Tara Singh Ji and Sri Maan Mahapurakh Sant Baba Charan Singh Ji is celebrated with fervor on the 1st of January. Amrit Sanchar, International Kabaddi matches and Mass marriages of poor girls are solemnized on 2nd January at Gurudwara Gurpuri Sahib.

It is one of the leading colleges which have started various professional computer and other job-oriented courses. The college is running courses in Arts, Commerce, Science and Computer Science streams. The college has secured a prestigious position in the field of education. It maintains a high academic standard. The college has experienced and hard working staff that work with a missionary zeal. Discipline and work-culture pervade the campus. The institution strictly adheres to the rules and regulations of the UGC, DPI and Guru Nanak Dev University/PSOU in all academic affairs.

UNIVERSITY RULES FOR PROMOTION

Under Semester System

For six semester courses :

- a There shall be no condition for promoting a student from first semester to second semester.
- b However the student shall be promoted to the third semester only if he/she has passed atleast 50% courses/papers of the first two semesters.
- c There shall be no condition for promoting a student from third semester to fourth semester.
- d However a student shall be promoted to fifth semester only if he/she has passed atleast 50% courses/papers of the first four semesters.
- e After the period of VI semesters, the student shall be given a period of two consecutive years to pass.

For four semester courses :

- a There shall be no condition for promoting a student from first semester to second semester.
- b However the student shall be promoted to the third semester only if he/she has passed atleast 50% courses/papers of the first two semesters.
- c There shall be no condition for promoting a student from third semester to fourth semester.
- d In case a student fails to pass all the courses/papers with in a period of four semesters/two years, he/she shall be given four consecutive semesters/two years more to pass.

Note : The rules given here can be changed by the university at any time.

Admission Guidelines & College Rules

Requirements at the time of Admission

- 1 Certificate of the lower examination passed. Original Certificate/DMC of 10+2 is must.
- 2 Original Character Certificate from the head of institution last attended.
- 3 Matric Certificate as proof of Date of Birth.
- 4 Migration Certificate to be produced in case of student coming from University or Board other than Guru Nanak Dev University/Punjab School Education Board & Eligibility Certificate issued by Guru Nanak Dev University.
- 5 Certificate regarding Backward Class/Schedule Caste /Handicapped or any other Category if applicable.
- 6 Copy of Aadhaar Card/Voter ID Card/Driving License as proof of address.
- 7 A copy of the bank account of the student.
- 8. 4 passport size recent photographs.

Eligibility for University Examination

A regular student must fulfill the following Conditions :

- 1 He must attend not less than 75% of the full course of the lectures delivered to his class in each of the subjects offered and 75% of the periods assigned to practical work in each subjects having practicals.
- 2 He must bear good moral character and his work must be satisfactory.
- 3 He must obtain atleast :

(a) 35% marks in each individual subject in the house examination/mid semester tests assigned for this purpose.

OR

(b) 30% marks in aggregate in all the subjects in the special house examinations which the principal of the college may hold at his discretion.

Important Instructions for Students

The total responsibility of having read the rules and regulations shall be upon the parents & students.

For the Attention of Parents and Students :

As a student of Guru Gobind Singh Khalsa College-

- a you have the right to expect a teacher to take your classes on time sincerely and effectively.
- b have the right to expect the teacher to grade and assess your progress regularly.
- c have the right to get credit for any original work you have produced.

At the same time as a student you are expected to

- a reach the class on time and attend your classes regularly as per the time-table.
- b expect the faculty members to give assignments for the evaluation of your progress.

It is in the interest of the students of Guru Gobind Singh Khalsa college that they should not involve in any such activity due to which the learning process gets affected. For instance missing classes and roaming aimlessly in the campus. There should be no cheating/ plagiarism or giving false statement to obtain concessions and falsification of information at any time.

- 1 It is obligatory for all students to obey college rules & regulations.
- 2 Students having compartment in 10+2 shall be admitted to Graduate Courses as per University Rules.
- 3 Admission to the courses having fixed number of seats will be held on the basis of merit/test.
- 4 Migration is not allowed for professional courses having fixed seats.
- 5 Rights regarding Migration are reserved with the Principal.
- 6 Personal presence is compulsory at the time of admission.
- 7 Admission will be cancelled & the fee deposited will not be refunded in case of any wrong/false information provided by the candidate in the admission form.
- 8 **All students must keep their identity cards with them and present them for inspection when requested to do so by a teacher or competent college authority. Students are not allowed to enter the college campus without their identity card.**
- 9 The right to admission is reserved with the Principal.
- 10 The Principal can refuse admission to any student & his or her admission can be cancelled without assigning any reason.
- 11 The fee will not be refunded in case the University or the Institution concerned cancels the admission of the student or the college after investigation finds a candidate guilty of some serious lapse.
- 12 Eligibility Certificate from Guru Nanak Dev University will have to be produced by those students who have passed their lower examination from a University or Board outside the Punjab.
- 13 Admission will be cancelled in case the fee is not deposited on time or by the date fixed.
- 14 **Information & rules and regulations given in this Prospectus can be changed from time to time.**
- 15 The candidate will not be allowed to sit in the university Examination in case his/her lectures are short or he/she does not get the required pass percentage in the House Tests / Mid Semester Test.
- 16 Political Activities of any kind are prohibited in the college.
- 17 It is the sole responsibility of students to deposit their fees and other dues in time which will be notified from time to time.
- 18 Photography of any kind is strictly prohibited in the college.

Care of College Property

- 1 Students of Guru Gobind Singh Khalsa College should look upon the college property building laboratories, buses, apparatus and class rooms as their special pride and refrain from any action that would disfigure or damage them. Offenders in this regard shall be severely dealt with by the college authorities.
- 2 Students who inadvertently cause any damage to college property are advised to report to the Principal immediately as to what has happened. This practice in honesty will stand them in good stead in their later life.
- 3 Students should scrupulously respect the belongings of their fellow students. If they discover any lost or forgotten article, they should deposit them immediately to the college office. The office will put up a notice regarding all lost articles instructing the owner to collect them as soon as possible. Students who are found in unlawful possession of articles of another student are liable to expulsion from the college.

Important Instructions Regarding Code of Conduct & Discipline

- 1 It is imperative to obey the rules set by the college.
- 2 Cooperate with college teachers to maintain discipline.
- 3 A Committee of Teachers regularly supervises discipline matters in the college.
- 4 The discipline committee after investigating a case of indiscipline or misbehaviour shall penalise the student concerned.
- 5 It is imperative for each student to keep the identity card issued by the college with him/her.
- 6 **Ragging in any form is strictly banned in the college campus. On being found guilty, strict disciplinary and legal action will be taken as per rules.**
- 7 Wearing kurta pajamas, chains, lockets and ear rings etc are prohibited in the college campus.
- 8 Wearing gaudy or gorgeous or improper dress is not allowed in the college campus.
- 9 Strict disciplinary action will be taken against students who do not bring books as per the instruction of their teachers misbehave with them or disrupt teaching in the class. Their parents will also be informed.
- 10 Strict disciplinary action will be taken against the student who causes damage to college property/infrastructure building furniture etc. The student will be penalized and the loss will be recovered from the student after due assessment.
- 11 Carrying mobile phones in college campus is strictly prohibited.
- 12 The college is not responsible for the loss of mobile or other valuables of a student in the college campus.
- 13 The college shall not be held responsible in any way for students sustaining injury or loss of any kind in accident or on account of their fighting among themselves.
- 14 Students are not allowed to form any student union or group or be a member/office bearer of a union or group in the college campus. The violator will be fined 5000 on the spot and disciplinary action will be taken against him.
- 15 Outside mischievous persons are not allowed to enter the college campus. The violator will be fined Rs. 10000/- on the spot and appropriate legal action will be taken against him.
- 16 Carrying deadly weapons of any kind is not allowed inside the college campus.

Rules Regarding College Bus

- 1 The student must keep the bus pass issued by the college with him/her.
- 2 Travelling by college bus without a valid bus pass is not allowed.
- 3 If a student fails to show the bus pass at the time of checking he/she can be heavily fined.
- 4 Using mobiles or listening to music songs etc is not allowed in the college bus.
- 5 If a student causes damage to college bus in any way he shall have to pay for the loss or damage.
- 6 If a student abuses/fights with bus driver or his/her mates, he/she can be suspended forthwith or heavily fined.
- 7 Girls should sit on the front seats and boys on the back seats in the bus.
- 8 If a student tampers with the bus pass and or tries to deceive the college regarding bus fee, he/she shall be fined a minimum of Rs. 1000 on the spot.

- 11 Bus fee once paid will not be refunded in any case.
- 12 In case of any bus problem or complaint against driver, do not argue or quarrel with the driver. Please report the matter to the bus incharge Prof. Jatinderpal Singh.

- 2 **It is the responsibility of students to read and follow these notices displayed on the Notice Boards.**
- 3 Ignorance or lack of any information will not be accepted or tolerated as a plea in any case. The college will not be held responsible for any loss or inconvenience what so ever as consequence of ignorance or lack of information on the part of the student.
- 4 It is imperative as well as the moral duty of the parents to keep in touch with the college authorities regarding the academic progress of their wards.
- 5 The college shall not be held responsible for the theft of vehicle, mobile or any other precious item of any student.
- 6 Punjabi is the medium for communication in the campus.
- 7 Seminars workshops & guest lectures are arranged from time to time throughout the Academic Session.

Fine

Library and Its Rules

The college is proud of its beautiful, big & computerized double storey library. It has important text books on all subjects & subscribes to literary magazines, current affairs magazines & newspapers etc. Recently the College has purchased latest encyclopedias to enrich our Library. We feel proud that our college library has a number of rare books on all the subjects. The Library has a collection of around 26000 books.





The library rules are briefly given below :

- 1 Each student must possess the Identity Card issued by the college in order to sit in the college library.
- 2 Carrying mobile phones are strictly prohibited in the college library.
- 3 Talking shouting or speaking loudly is strictly prohibited in the college library.
- 4 The proper order of furniture and chairs in the college library must not be disturbed.
- 5 Read books in the library with solemnity.
- 6 Only two books can be issued to a student at a time and for 15 days only against the library identity card. Keeping books for more than 15 days entails a fine as per library rules.
- 7 If a book is damaged in any way or marked or torn or lost by a student he or she will have to pay twice the price of the book. If the book is part of a set of volumes & is not available separately, the price of the whole set will have to be paid.
- 8 Reference books, newspapers, magazines and books reserved specially shall not be issued to the students.
- 9 The librarian can recall a book from a student at any time.
- 10 Carrying deadly weapons of any kind is not allowed inside the college library.

Fee Concession

- 1 Fee concession will be given to needy/Amritdhari Sikh students according to their academic performance and after the recommendation of the designated committee & approval by the Patron of the college.
- 2 Application for fee concession will be accepted only from July to October in a session. Thereafter no application will be accepted.
- 3 Fee concession is not a legal right but only a relief or concession to the needy/deserving students according to the rules.
- 4 Concessions will also be given to the meritorious students who secure position in the university merit list and sports persons as per college rules.
- 5 If a student is involved in acts of indiscipline or misconduct or does not take house exams or does not fulfill the university conditions his/her fee concession will be withdrawn.
